



Opportunities matrix

What is it? This tool will help you to sort and prioritise potential project ideas.

How to use it? First, decide on the criteria for evaluating each of the project ideas. The table on the right suggests four sets of criteria - modify this list based on your context.

It would be the best to organise the scoring in a participatory way. Give each participant stickers in different colours (red, orange, yellow) or ask them to assign points 1-3. Ask them to put red stickers or 3 points to the criteria that the project successfully fulfilled, and yellow sticker or 1 point to the criteria that was not fully fulfilled.

The overall score for each project will help you shortlist those that resonate the most with your criteria and stakeholders involved in ranking. Select top projects, and discuss their aspects in detail, as the scoring system might not make all the nuances visible. You can also rank projects by specific criteria, for example - target group needs.

Different mind: stakeholders may have opposing opinions about the proposals, so make sure to run this workshop with different participants to get a holistic understanding.
